We applaud those who roam off the beaten path and adventure into areas unknown. Among the stack shelves, (they are always located in the corners, sides, and back of libraries), you'll find quite a few gems. Some books might need a light dusting or reinforcing with tape, others are just waiting for discovery. Anyway, my travels up and down the aisles have given me plenty to savor. I didn't even have to bring a camera along for this trip!

excluded from this offer.)


BOOK SALESWendy Edlen

My book suggestions are two excellent biographies by Mary S. Lovell: A Scandalous Life: The Biography of Jane Digby, and Cast No Shadow, The Life of the American Who Changed the Course of World War II.

I am reading My Brilliant Friend, Book One of the wonderful new series by Elena Ferrante. The book tells the story of two childhood friends in an Italian city outside of Naples. It is a heartwarming slice of childhood and lifelong friendship. However what really makes the book fascinating is the enticing backdrop of postwar Italy!

I am also enjoying a cozy classic mystery, **The Woman in White** by Wilkie Collins. Quite frequently cited as one of the top mystery books of all time. What a classic - a gothic mystery tale - that is chock full of interesting characters (a bon-bon eating count with a penchant for white mice!) and enthralling right up to the end. Perfect book for a rainy El Nino day!

Days of Abandonment, by Elena
Ferrante, and The Children Act by Ian
McEwan each begin with a similar
personal and hurtful event. However, the
responses and actions of the main
characters differ greatly with poignant
results. I recommend both of these
outstanding novels.

The Boys in the Boat by James Brown – An irresistible story about nine Americans and their epic quest for Gold at the 1936 Berlin Olympics. This is a story about courage, perseverance and excitement.

Dead Wake by Erik Larson. This is a story about the last crossing of the Lusitania. A fascinating account of a tragic event during World War I. It sheds much light on Europe, America, and the politics of the time.
